In addition to planes and historic artifacts, attendees were able to wander through the museum's library which hosts nearly 6,300 volumes primarily related to aviation and American military history. 60/91/215 Corridor Project - 2009 Legacy Project

The 60/91/215 Corridor Improvement Project in Riverside and Moreno Valley reconstructed the 60/91/215 Interchange, added auxiliary lanes and reconstructed several overpasses on State Route 60 (SR-60), State Route 91 (SR-91) and Interstate 215 (I-215). This project used Design Sequencing; a method where the project is bid, awarded, and construction starts before 100% completion of the plans. With Design Sequencing, seven individual projects were combined into one to accelerate project delivery, reduce construction time, and provide congestion relief to an area experiencing increased traffic demand due to growth and development.
